

History



Dr. Isaac Ladipo Oluwole (1892-1953)

O.B.E, M.B. CH, B., D.TM. & H., D.PH.

Father of Public Health in Nigeria

r. Isaac Ladipo Oluwole was born to Isaac Oluwole and Abigail Johnson in 1892. His father, Bishop Isaac Oluwole was an Anglican bishop of Sierra Leonean and Egba heritage. He had his secondary school education in Lagos at the CMS Grammar School and later King's College. In 1913, Oluwole was admitted to study medicine at the University of Glasgow where he graduated with MB.ChB in 1918.

Dr. Oluwole started very early to show interest in Community Health while he was in private practice in Abeokuta on his return to Nigeria, and this led him to return to Glasgow soon after to obtain a Doctorate in Public Hygiene (DPH), which further

prepared him for the monumental public health success that he went on to accomplish.

Dr. Oluwole established the first school of Hygiene in Nigeria, located at Yaba Lagos, in 1920, when he observed that the poor implementation of public health regulations was, in part, due to the paucity of trained public health practitioners at the time. His leadership ability and drive to improve the health workforce were evident in these actions.

In 1924, he reorganized sanitary inspection procedures to control the spread of bubonic plague in the country. He also worked to reclaimed swampy islands to aid in malaria control, and built a new abattoir to improve foodhygiene.

Dr. Oluwole started the first school health services in Lagos in 1925, introducing regular sanitary inspections and vaccinations of children. His service delivery interventions were obvious as he was credited with setting up Massey Street Dispensary on the Lagos Island and later another clinic in Ebute Meta for Lagos Mainland residents. The Massey dispensary transformed to the Massey Street Hospital, which continues to contribute significantly to maternal health services in Nigeria.

Dr. Oluwole made significant contributions and improvements to public health services in Nigeria - environmental health including regular sanitary inspections, food hygiene, etc.; school health services; childhood immunization; and all



these before he was appointed Medical Officer of Health in 1936. His revolutionary and selfless services were recognized even by the colonial masters, earning him the prestigious "Officer of the Order of the British Empire" (OBE) award in 1940.

According to Charles De Gaulle, "Nothing great will ever be achieved without great men, and men are great only if they are determined to be so." This statement definitely holds true for Dr. Oluwole as his determination to succeed and make things better in the health sector, even with the many limitations in his era, must have been his driving force. These accomplishments and more earned him the well-deserved appellation of "Father of Public Health in Nigeria" when he died in 1953.

With a great passion for excellence and the common good, Dr. Oluwole was able to institute some elements of a functional health system back in his time. This is why he will continue to be remembered... as according to Jules Renard, "The reward of great men is that, long after they have died, one is not quite sure that they are dead."



HISTORY AND EVOLUTION OF ASSOCIATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH PHYSICIANS OF NIGERIA (1974 - 2024)

The Association of Public Health Physicians of Nigeria (APHPN) was birthed by our founding fathers on the 30th of March, 1974, in Lagos, as the Association of Community Physicians of Nigeria (ACPN) whose membership was restricted to only people who had acquired the full professional fellowship in Community

full professional fellowship in Community Medicine. ACPN was renamed APHPN in 2007 to reflect the broad and all-inclusive nature of our membership in the field of Community Medicine. APHPN is now a professional association made up of disciplinary Public Health/Community Health Physicians in Nigeria, holding various positions in the LGAs, state ministries, federal ministries, parastatals, universities, teaching hospitals, international agencies, NGOs, research institutes and private medical practice. The Association is also open to all registered Medical and Dental Practitioners in Nigeria with recognized postgraduate qualification in Public Health or Community Medicine. In addition, Medical Officers of Health (MOH) in the local government areas are members of the association.

Aim and Objectives

- 1. To promote Public Health, Community Medicine and Allied Medicine.
- 2. To maintain the honour and interest of the health profession.
- 3. To promote improvement in the practice, training and research in Public Health and Community Medicine.
- 4. To promote improvement in the health of the public in Nigeria.
- 5. To consider and express its views on all proposed legislation and development plans affecting Public Health, Community Medicine, Medical and Dental Profession.



Organizational Structure

Between 1974 and 1983, the then ACPN was headed by a Ceremonial President. In 1983, the position of the head of the Association was changed to National Chairman at the conference held in Ile-Ife. However, the position of Ceremonial President was retained until 2007 when ACPN transitioned to APHPN, and was registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) of the Federal Republic of Nigeria (CAC No 130088).


The foundation Ceremonial President, Prof. Umaru Shehu became the Chairman of the APHPN Board of Trustees (BOT). Following a constitutional amendment in 2019 at the conference in Enugu, the position of National Chairman was changed to President.


The APHPN BOT is made up of five members. The day to day running of the Association is coordinated by the National Officers. The national officers of the Association include the President, Vice-President I, Vice-President II, Secretary-General, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Publicity Secretary, Internal Auditor and Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Community Medicine and Primary Health Care (JCMPHC). In addition, APHPN has state branches headed by a State Chairman and with a State Deputy Chairman, State Secretary, and State Treasurer as other members of the State Council. The National Officers and the Chairmen and Secretaries of the state branches constitute the National Executive Council (NEC). Since 1974 till date, APHPN has had twelve Chairmen/Presidents.





APHPN Membership


PHPN has six categories of members namely: Ordinary members, Fellow members, Life members, Senior members, Associate members, and Honorary members.





At the Abuja conference in 2011, two honorary members, Dr. Tunde Fakunle, a paediatrician, and Dr. Wale Okediran, a private medical practitioner were inducted as honorary members of APHPN. APHPN have also had two corporate members: Nigerian Public Health Foundation and Diabetic and Hypertension Help Society.

In 2011, the first and only APHPN membership directory was published by the Prof. Okojie led EXCO. The contact details of members, state of practice and area of special interest were captured in the directory.



APHPN Constitution

he constitution of APHPN was produced by the Prof. Asuzu led EXCO in 2006. In 2017, the Prof. Uzochukwu led EXCO set up a constitution review committee headed by Prof. James Bamidele to review the APHPN constitution. The revised constitution was approved at the Enugu conference in 2019.

One remarkable amendment to the APHPN constitution was that members who wish to serve in the National EXCO would have to indicate interest by submitting nomination forms to the National Secretariat four weeks before the date of the election, and the list of nominees are published by the Secretary General at least two weeks before the AGM.



The Birth of Sister Associations -

Formation of EPiSON and SPHPN

In 2010, at the conference held in Lagos, APHPN gave birth to the multidisciplinary Epidemiological Society of Nigeria (EPiSON). Prof. K. Sabitu and Dr. A. O. Adebiyi were elected as inaugural president and secretary, respectively. In 2012, at the APHPN conference which was held back-to-back with the EPiSON conference in Calabar, the Africa Epidemiological Association was inaugurated by EPiSON, with members drawn from Cameroun, Nigeria and South Africa. In 2012, APHPN also spearheaded the formation of the Society for Public Health Professionals of Nigeria (SPHPN). The Prof. Okojie led EXCO had earlier in 2010 sought the reactivation of the membership of APHPN in the World Federation of Public Health Associations (WFPHA). This request was not granted because APHPN did not meet the WFPHA membership criteria, that it must be a multidisciplinary public health association. However, APHPN was readmitted as a Sustaining Member in WFPHA in 2010. In May 2014, Prof. T. M. Akande, the then National Chairman of APHPN presented SPHPN with Prof. M. C. Asuzu as inaugural President, to the annual meeting of the WFPHA in held in Geneva. Thus, SPHPN was admitted as a Full Member of WFPHA while the sustaining membership of APHPN in the WFPHA ceased.



At the 2011 conference in Abuja, it was resolved that the tenure of the Editor-in-Chief should be a single tenure of six years.

The journal publishes regularly and is currently indexed in African Journals Online; Cross Ref; Asian Digital Library; Google Scholar; IJI Factor. Very soon the journal will be indexed in Elsevier and other international indexing bodies.



Conferences

Since 2007, the annual scientific conference and general meeting of the Association has been consistent. Research and Grants Committee

n 2022, the committee carried out a nationwide survey tagged "the COVID-19 mandate project" among civil servants in Nigeria across twelve states, and the FCT within the six geopolitical zones. The outcome of this project includes a policy brief to relevant stakeholders on the subject, a quantitative research manuscript published in the Journal of Community Medicine and Primary Health Care titled "Knowledge, Perception, and Uptake of Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccination among Nigerian Civil Servants: Implications for Evidence-Based Policies" (DOI: 10.4314/jcmphc.v35i2.9) and a

qualitative manuscript titled "Views of Nigerian civil servants about compulsory COVID-19 vaccination: A qualitative study" has been publish in the African Journal of Primary Health Care & Family Medicine. (DOI: 10.4102/phcfm.v16i1.4208)

The committee contributed technically to the successful execution of the healthcare in danger (HCiD) project carried out by APHPN on behalf of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). The project titled "Comparative Assessment of the Prevalence and Patterns of violence against healthcare in Nigeria" has been completed, its report has been written and submitted to ICRC. The manuscript is currently being developed for publication.

The committee has applied for research grants and looks forward to success in grant execution, where selected.

Association of Public Health Physicians of Nigeria: Place and Purpose in the COVID-19 Pandemic Response and Management

he COVID-19 pandemic was an unprecedented event of this century that shook the whole world and filled every individual with uncertainly, terror and apprehension. This new disease was poorly understood and brought to fore the unique and multi-faceted role of the public health and community physician in preventing disease, prolonging life, and promoting physical health and efficiency, through organized community efforts, for the sanitation of the environment, the control of community infections, the education of the individual in the principles of personal hygiene, the organization of medical and nursing service for the early detection and preventive treatment of disease, and the development of the social machinery which will ensure to every individual in the community a standard of living adequate for the maintenance of health.

This came to light when members of the association at all levels of healthcare delivery (primary, secondary and tertiary) including those in the Ministries, Department and Agencies (MDAs) were at the forefront of the COVID-19 pandemic response and management, acting as key figures in safeguarding the health and well-being of Nigerians.

As public health and community physicians, we possess a unique set of skills that blend medical expertise with a deep understanding of population health dynamics. Our knowledge and skillset in disease epidemiology, biostatistics, disease modelling, surveillance, etc. which allowed for close monitoring of disease patterns, transmission, timely identification of emerging threats contributed to the rapid deployment of interventions, helping to contain and mitigate the impact of the pandemic. We also leveraged on integrating technologies such as data analytics, modeling, and digital communication tools which enhanced the speed and accuracy of decision-making, allowing for more efficient resource allocation and response strategies.

During the pandemic, public health physicians were at the forefront, collaborating with various stakeholders, including policy makers, government agencies, healthcare providers, and community leaders. Our leadership skills were paramount in coordinating a cohesive and effective response. In managing the pandemic, public health physicians engaged in comprehensive risk assessments to understand the potential long-term consequences of the outbreak. We also contributed to the development of evidence-based policies, protocols and guidelines aimed at mitigation and strengthening the overall health infrastructure. Our collaborations went beyond the Nigerian borders as public health physicians engaged in regional and global efforts to address the pandemic. Our members participated in collaborative research, development of regional and global health policies, as well as information sharing on best practices to improve our collective ability to mitigate the effects of the pandemic.

Since clear and timely communication is essential for gaining public trust, we also played a critical role in risk communication as we bridged the gap between scientific knowledge and public understanding. Members were involved in health education and promotion programmes by encouraging adherence to mitigation measures, and dispelling misinformation that could have exacerbated rumours and panics. By empowering individuals with the necessary tools and knowledge, public health physicians contributed to building a resilient and informed Nigerian populace. We also provided technical expertise in the area of facilitation of training workshops and seminars on outbreak preparedness, response protocols, and mitigation methods to enhance the knowledge and skills of healthcare professionals, community leaders, and the general public.

Our multifaceted skill sets and expertise as public health physicians became indispensable in the response and management of the COVID-19 pandemic, waging war in a frontline battle against a new and unpredictable enemy, wreaking havoc across the world. From early detection and effective coordination to risk communication, policy development, education, and regional/global collaboration, we were instrumental in safeguarding public health and mitigating the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic while ensuring the health and well-being of the Nigerian populace.
