WELCOME ADDRESS BY THE CHAIRMAN, APHPN OGUN STATE BRANCH

DR. DANIFI A. ADESANYA

t is with great excitement that I welcome you all to the Gateway state. Our state is the gateway to the development of Nigeria. God destined that deliberately and placed us geographically to ensure that every good thing that brings prosperity has to pass through us.

Your Excellency, Royal Fathers, highly respected public health physicians, ladies and gentlemen, our state is also the gateway to the development of public health and primary healthcare in Nigeria. This is evident in the human resources that are naturally bestowed in us. Late Prof Olikoye Ransome Kuti, a proud son of Ogun State was the first to attempt to reach all citizens with health services. This was done through the basic health services in the 70s even before the world promulgated primary health care as a strategy to reaching all. He was the one, as minister in 1986, that brought together a committee that produced the National Health Policy of 1988.

Late Prof Olanipekun Kayode Alausa, also from our dear state, was a giant in the mentoring of public health physicians. A very selfless and respected elder, he left the office as Provost of College of Medicine in a Federal University to take up appointment as Head of Department in Ogun State University(now Olabisi Onabanjo University), from where he rose to become Dean, Provost, Deputy VC and even the Registrar of Post Graduate Medical College. Additionally, he was key mentor to

physicians in Federal Medical Centre, Abeokuta, Babcock University Teaching Hospita, Ilisan and Olabisi Onabanjo University Teaching Hospital, Sagamu. Let me quickly add that he was the one who convinced us to bid for hosting and also went ahead to plead with National Executive Council to approve our bid to host this 41st AGM and scientific conference.

Ladies and Gentlemen, leaders of public health produced by Ogun State cannot be fully mentioned in one breath. We have so many others including Prof Osibogun (Former CMD, LUTH), Prof Onajole, Prof Fatusi (Former VC, UNIMED), Dr Akin Adebiyi (President IEA), Dr B.K. Ipaye (Former Commissioner for Health) and very importantly, Dr Tomi Coker, the Honorable State Commissioner for Health. Permit me to quickly add that our dear governor, Prince Dapo Abiodun, MFR is an award winner in Disease Surveillance. Dear participants, we are not only proud to produce achievers in public health. We also have tourist sites for you to visit. The Olusegun Obasanjo Presidential Library and Olumo Rock are located within Abeokuta. One of the best textile materials in the world is Kampala and it is manufactured here in Abeokuta. Please don't forget that the best garri in the world is made in Ijebu while Ado-Odo/Ota Local Government has the highest concentration of industries in Nigeria. No state in Nigeria produces the same number of Universities we have in Ogun State and despite that we have the lowest crime rate. You therefore have nothing to fear as you navigate through Ogun State. Only God can guarantee security of any individual but I can assure you that we have smart and highly professional security agencies to assist in areas where there are security concerns.

The autonomy granted to Local Governments by the Supreme Court is a welcome development but serious care needs to be taken for it not to work against implementation of Primary Health Care Under One Roof. The JAPA syndrome has greatly created a big pressure on the human resources for health especially at the primary health care level. This is worsened by the reduction in the value of our currency thereby increasing the cravings for foreign currencies. Our road infrastructure and lack of

efficient transport system are contributing greatly to high cost of foods and drugs to reduce accessibility to health services. The greatest challenge that has just reared its ugly head is the withdrawal of United States of America from WHO and by extension withdrawal of aids for our public health services. This portends grave danger for us as a nation and is a wake up bell for all of us in public health practice.

I am greatly indebted to Dr Terfa Kene of Ave Sense who linked us with some of our sponsors. I must appreciate Access Bank, UNFPA, Shell Petroleum and APIN for sponsoring us. I cannot forget the personal efforts of Dr Tomi Coker (HSCH), Dr B.K. Ipaye (former HSCH), Dr Akin Adebiyi (UCH), Prof Abiodun (Babcock) and Prof Fatusi (UNIMED). I also greatly appreciate Precious Pharmacy led by Dr Bola Aroniwura and Royal Institute of Health Technology, Ifo led by Dr Mrs M.O Adesanya. The Executive Secretary, Ogun PHC Board also played tremendous role in our fund raising activities. The CMDs of BUTH, OOUTH, FMC, Abeokuta and NPH, Aro were supportive. He did not only accept the invitation with utmost enthusiasm but also donated generously towards the hosting.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to my president, Prof Alphonsus Isara and the National Executive Council for entrusting us with the responsibility of hosting this conference. I look forward to a successful 41st annual general meeting and scientific conference and impactful experience for us all. I promise all participants a memorable stay in Abeokuta. lumuyiwa Omotola Odusanya acknowledges the mercy and grace of God in his life. All the glory goes to God alone. Indeed, as the scriptures declare, no man can receive anything except it is given from above (John 3:27, Holy Bible, King James version).

Professor Olumuyiwa Odusanya had his humble beginnings in Lagos, born to Pa Kehinde and Madam Adetola Odusanya, both of blessed memory. He is from Igbooye, in Eredo Local Council Development Area, Epe, Lagos State. He had his primary school education at the Yaba Methodist Primary School from 1971 to 1976 and finished with distinction grade at the First School Leavers Certificate Examination. He attended Federal Government College Lagos, Ijanikin for his secondary school education from 1976 to 1981 and did the one year of the sixth form at the same school, in 1982.

He studied Medicine and Surgery at the College of Medicine, University of Lagos, Idi-Araba from 1982 to 1988 where he obtained the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (M.B; B.S.) degree. He was a pre-registration house officer at the Baptist Hospital Ogbomosho, Oyo State from 1988 to 1989 and completed the National Youth Service Corps service in Anambra State at the Nigerian Air Force Flying School, Enugu and Udi Local Government Area (LGA) from 1989 to 1990. He was in private medical practice from 1990 to 1991. He worked briefly at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Yaba from 1992 to 1993.

Professor Odusanya commenced postgraduate training in public health at the College of Medicine, University of Lagos, and obtained the Masters of Public Health (MPH) degree in 1992. His residency training in Public Health and Community Medicine was at the Lagos University Teaching Hospital, Idi-Araba from 1993 to 1995. During the residency training, Professor Odusanya was the best candidate of the Faculty of Public Health and Community Medicine of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria (NPMCN), at both Part I and II examinations and became a Fellow of the College in 1995. He acquired a Diploma in Management of Higher Educational Institutes from Galilee International Management Institute, Israel in 2019. He also obtained a Certificate in Achieving Leadership Excellence from the London School of Economics and Political Science, the United Kingdom in 2020. In 2021, Professor Odusanya was elected as a Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Medicine. Professor Odusanya obtained the Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria in 2024.

Professor Odusanya was appointed Medical Adviser, SmithKline Beecham (SB) for the Anglophone West African Region in 1996. He started the clinical drug development programme for the organization and undertook clinical trials undertaken at many university teaching hospitals in Nigeria, thus contributing to development of medicines and building the capacity of health workers. In the same organization, in 1997, he established a model primary care center in collaboration with Lagos State Family Support Programme which provided health services to an under-served population in Mafowoku, Somolu Local Government Area (LGA) of Lagos State. Furthermore, he was project manager of a child health programme privately funded by SmithKline

























Beecham from 1998 to 2014 that immunized several thousands of children in Owan-West LGA, and its environs in Edo State.

Professor Odusanya worked as National Professional Officer in charge of Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response Programme (IDSR)/Avian Influenza (AI) at the World Health Organization, Nigeria, where he actively participated in the control of AI and establishment of the IDSR programme in Nigeria. He has served Lagos State, as the Executive Vice-Chairman of the Health Advocacy Implementation Committee of the Ministry of Health from 2005 to 2007 and is currently Chairman of Lagos State Health Research Ethics Committee. He was the Chairman of the Lagos State Nursing Education Committee and led the efforts in establishing the Lagos State College of Nursing from 2012 to 2014.

Professor Olumuyiwa Odusanya joined the services of Lagos State University at the College of Medicine as Lecturer Grade I in 1999 as one of the pioneer staff and was promoted to the position of a full professor in 2008. He was appointed an honorary consultant community physician to the Lagos State University Teaching Hospital, Ikeja in 2003. He has been very active in teaching, research and provision of services within the clinical settings and the Community. He has been involved in the training of undergraduates and Post graduate students (Masters level, resident doctors and Ph.D.). He has contributed in many ways to the growth and development of both institutions. He has served as: Ag. Head, Department of Community Health and Primary Health Care (2009); Ag. Dean Faculty of Clinical Sciences (2010 to 2012): and Provost (2012 to 2014). During the period of his stewardship as Provost, the College of Medicine passed all its accreditations, had its quota of medical students increased by the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria. In addition, during the period he was the provost, the Bachelor of Dental Surgery and the Bachelor of Nursing Sciences programme were strengthened and put on sound footing.

He was pioneer Director Research Management and Innovation at Lagos State University from 2017 to 2020 where in conjunction with others got Lagos State University to be ranked as the secondbest university in Nigeria by Times Higher Education. Moreover, he started the Lagos State University Research Fair in 2018 which is now held annually. Professor Odusanya was also a visiting Professor to the University of Ibadan at the Department of Community Health in the College of Medicine. He has served as external examiner to several Nigeria universities, assessor for professorial candidates in universities in and outside Nigeria and expert at professorial interviews.

Professor Odusanya has served as a resource person for the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria and Faculty of Public Health and Community Medicine and as an examiner at both Part I and II examinations. He has served as the third Senate member of the Faculty of Public Health and Community Medicine. He has been an associate Editor, Editor I and now a

National Editorial Adviser of the Nigerian Postgraduate Medical Journal. He had served as Vice- Chairman of the Lagos State Branch of the Association of Public Health Physicians of Nigeria and Editor of the Journal of Community Medicine and Primary Health Care.

He has attended several conferences both in and outside Nigeria where he presented papers. His research interests are in in clinical epidemiology, clinical trials, infectious diseases and health systems. Of note is that Professor Odusanya was the Principal Investigator for the phase III vaccine trial for the 10valent pneumococcal conjugate vaccine now used in the National Programme on Immunization. He has published over 120 papers.

Professor Olumuyiwa Odusanya is a member of several professional bodies including the Society for Public Health Professionals of Nigeria (SPHPN), the Association of Public Health Professionals of Nigeria (APHPN), Medical and Dental Consultants Association of Nigeria and is a member of the New York Academy of Sciences.

Professor Odusanya was appointed pioneer and substantial Vice-Chancellor Lagos State University of Science and Technology, Ikorodu in September, 2022. He has developed the "IMPACT" vision; a six-initiative strategic agenda aimed at rapidly making the institution become a highly competitive, much sought-after, globally acclaimed, world-class university. He has continued to devote his energy to the assignment and leads by example. He has served as Chairman of the Lagos State Health Research Committee. In 2024, the Lagos State Government appointed Professor Odusanya as Chairman of the Lagos State Science and Innovation Council.

Professor Odusanya is a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, his saviour from his early teenage years. He has held several leadership positions in the service of the lord as youth leader, Sunday School teacher, President, Christian Fellowship Group, College of Medicine, University of Lagos, President, Anambra State Christian Corpers Fellowship. His goal in life is encapsulated in Philippians 1:21 "for to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain". He is Pastor of the Jesus Family Bible Church, Shasha in Lagos. Professor Olumuyiwa Odusanya is married to Morenike Omonike Odusanya, an educationist and they have two children, an accountant and a lawyer.

The Life and Times of PROFESSOR OLANIPEKUN ALAUSA A DOYEN OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Parental Background

The courtship between Late Alhaji Mustapha Salami and Late Alhaja Abibat Olayinka resulted in a marriage that brought about the families of Alausa of Idewon quarters and Senbanjo Onselu of Araromi quarters both of Ijebu-Ode into a unified relationship.

His father was a famous, influential, highly religious and respected great man called Alhaji Mustapha Salami Alausa. Alhaji M.S. Alausa was a prominent Muslim leader who was known across the old Western Region of Nigeria because of his contribution to the development of Islam. He was a foundation member of the Ansar-Ud-Deen Society in Ijebu land. His tremendous contribution to the completion of the Central Mosque Ijebu-Ode is "Never to be forgotten". He also contributed in large dimensions, both financially and morally to the establishment of many primary and secondary Muslim schools in Ijebu-Land. He was the Balogun Zumratul Hujjaj of Yoruba land until he died in September 1983.

His mother was the lovely, kind and highly enterprising Alhaja Abibat Olayinka, a baker, with the factory at the family house at Obalende. She moved to her house after the death of her husband. She was blessed with many children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She died in April 2000.

His Birth

Mama Alhaja Abibat Olayinka had been pregnant for about nine months and the Alausa and Onselu families were full of expectations about the coming of the visitor. Little did they know that the new addition would arrive on the 1st of August 1943! So, the icon we are honouring today announced his arrival with the usual cry of a newborn baby and on the 8th day, he was named **KAMIL OLANIPEKUN**. He was highly cherished at birth being the 1st male child of his maternal family, but the 15th in the Alausa dynasty.

Educational Sojourn

Professor Olanipekun Kamil Alausa attended Ansar-Ud-Deen Primary School Ijebu-Ode between 1950 and 1956. During his formative years, he spent the greater part of his childhood life with his grandmother Madam Arodu Salamotu Onselu at Oketun/Ita-Ntebo area of Ijebu-Ode.

He had his Secondary School Education between 1957 and 1961 at the famous Ijebu Muslim College, Ijebu-Ode, where he excelled academically and socially. He made most of his present-day friends during that period.

The Professor belonged to the first set of Higher School Certificate (HSC) students at Molusi College Ijebu-Igbo between 1962 and 1963, when Mr. Olarenwaju was the principal.

In his quest to have the best in education, Professor O.K. Alausa went further to attend Nigeria's Premier University, the University of Ibadan, between1964 and 1967 for his first degree (B.Med.Sc. Hons Degree) obtained in Medical Microbiology at the age of 24, under the tutelage of Professor David Montefiore, Dr. A.O. Okubadejo and Professor Olu Osoba. He went further to have his second degree (M.B.B.S) from the same University (U.I.) in June 1970.

As a determined person, Prof. Alausa forged ahead in search of knowledge in very wide dimensions, and this led to his obtaining many certificates and honours to his educational credit. These include the following just to mention a few:

- The examination council for Foreign Medical graduates (E.C.F.M.G.) United States of America; 1970
- The Postgraduate Diploma in Bacteriology from Victoria University of Manchester, United Kingdom in June 1973, under the supervision of Professor Patrick Collard and Professor Beesick with the Commonwealth Scholarship.
- The Postgraduate Certificate in Immunology from the University of Ibadan in 1974 under the late Professor Siji Osunkoya.
- 4. He was appointed a lecturer I/Consultant in 1974 which was just a period of four years after obtaining his M.B.B.S Degree.
- The professional certificate in Investigation, Surveillance and Control of communicable diseases from the Department of Public Health Laboratory Service, United Kingdom in 1975 with the British Council Scholarship
- 6. The International Certificate in Epidemiology by the World Health Organisation (WHO) in 1976.
- 7. The Doctor of Medicine (M.D. Degree) in 1978, from the University of Ibadan under the supervision of Professor David G. Montefiore and the M.P.H. Degree in Epidemiology and Tropical Public Health from the prestigious Havard University, United States of America in 1978 under Professor Thomas Weller (a Nobel Prize Winner in medicine for Oral Polio Vaccine)
- 8. The Certificate in Epidemiology and Public Administration from the Centre for Diseases Control and Prevention, Atlanta, United States of America in 1979.
- 9. Fellowship of the West African College of Physicians in Pathology (FWCPH) in 1979.
- Fellowship of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria in Pathology (FMCPath) in 1982.
- 11. Fellowship in Community Health from the West African College of Physicians in 1985.





























- 12. Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of the United Kingdom (FRCPath) in 1991 and;
- Fellowship in Public Health (FMCPH) at the National 13. Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria in 1992

An Accomplished Scholar

Professor Olanipekun Kamil Alausa has over 90 Medical and Scientific publications in the areas of Public Health, Medical Microbiology, Infectious Diseases (including Sexually Transmitted Diseases and HIV/AIDS), Medical Education and Health Services Administration and Management. To justify his great effort in the field of his professional choice (Medicine), the man became a Professor in March 1980 when he was just 36 years of age.

Professor O.K. Alausa proved his academic prowess, diligence, and capability by working successfully in the following roles;

- 1. Dean/Provost of three Medical Schools in Nigeria (Ilorin, Kano and Sagamu) where he initiated Community Oriented Medical Education Programmes.
- 2. The Chief Medical Director at two University Teaching Hospitals (Ilorin and Sagamu)
- 3. The Registrar and the Chief Operating Officer of the Nigerian Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria
- Chairman of the West African College of Physicians (Faculty 4. of Community Health). In addition, he also served on the council of the college for several years.
- The World Health Organisation (WHO) contact person in 5. Nigeria for community-oriented Medical Education between 1985 and 1990
- 6. He also had a stint in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in pursuance of his medical career, where he was the chairman of the Medical Microbiology Department in one of the tertiary hospitals.
- 7. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academics), Olabisi Onabanjo University (OOU), Ago-Iwoye between 2005 and 2007
- 8. Appointed as the Chairman Board of Trustees (BOT) of the Society for Public Health Professionals of Nigeria. Formerly Public Health Association of Nigeria (PHAN).

Contributions to the development of Nigeria University Systems

As a matter of distinct recognition in the educational field, many institutions across Nigeria sought his contributions towards the establishment of public and private universities and institutions. Some of these are;

- 8. Department of Community Medicine, Babcock University, Ilishan-2014-2023

A Socialite and Philanthropist

Despite the high attention that his career and profession demanded, Professor Alausa still found time for social activities. He was not one of the harsh and non-approachable academics that our people call "Alakada t'o nroju koi koi" as he identified with his people, did not forget his place of birth and his impact is still felt in different facets of community development which includes:

- His membership of Egbe Bobagbuyi (Okunrin) Akile Ijebu where he was active and made notable contributions
- He was a member and past president of I-JAY (1969) KLUB. A club known for philanthropy and community development.
- 3. This erudite Professor was an active and prominent member of IMCOSA 57 set; an Association of Old Students of his 2nd Alma Mata, Muslim College, Ijebu-Ode.

When Professor Kamil Alausa celebrated his 70th birthday in Aug 2013 and as a mark of appreciation to God, he and his family decided to renovate a Lying In (Maternity) Ward of the General Hospital Ijebu-Ode.

Submission To Allah (SWT) and Religious Recognition

Professor Kamil Alausa performed his first pilgrimage in December 1971 and repeated the journey to the holy land seven times, thereafter. His activities, dedication and meritorious service to Islam were notable and this culminated in his appointment by the old western state and present Ogun State government to lead the Hajj medical team to the holy land. His team served each administration for two years respectively. He was honoured with the Chieftaincy title of Alatilehin Adinni of the Central Mosque, Ijebu-Ode on 24th June 2012 by the ljebu-Ode Muslim Community, in recognition of his contributions to Islam. He was a prominent member of the Elders Council of NASFAT, Ijebu-Ode Branch and served on the Governing Council of Fountain University Osogbo, Osun State.

A Sportsman

As a man of many parts, Professor O.K. Alausa scheduled his programme from the beginning to involve extracurricular activities. During his days at Molusi College for his Higher School Certificate (HSC), he was a member of the formidable team of MOLUSI that was famous and had the credibility of being the best team in the Old Western region.

Blessings of God

Professor Olanipekun Kami Alausa is blessed with six lovely children: Mrs Abiola Ojo-Osagie, Mr Babalola Alausa, Mr Kayode Alausa, Dr Toyin Alausa, Mrs Funmilayo Fadoju and Mr Oluwabunmi Alausa and with twelve lovely grandchildren.

Conclusion

It is one thing to come to life by biological delivery; it is another thing for one to chart a path of success. The greatest of all is for God to grant the grace that is required for life's journey. God was good to Prof. O.K. Alausa. Professor Olanipekun Kamil Alausa passed on in the early hours of Friday, 10th November 2023, after a distinguished and fulfilling life.
